Josh joined Cloch Housing Association in 2022 after winning Inverclyde Council's version of *The Apprentice*, at the age of 17. Since then, he has rapidly progressed through a Modern Apprenticeship in IT and is now undertaking a Graduate Apprenticeship in Cyber Security. His work has already made a significant impact.

Beyond his technical achievements, Josh has demonstrated a strong commitment to community engagement. He led a Digital Inclusion Project at a local sheltered housing complex, supporting older



tenants in building digital confidence – from online shopping and fraud awareness to using digital tools for entertainment and connection.

Josh is also actively involved in shaping the future of the sector. He contributes to Cloch's Wellbeing, Pension, and Customer Involvement groups, and has co-authored articles for *Scottish Housing News*. His sector engagement includes co-presenting at the SHARE Inspiring Leadership Conference and supporting IT diagnostics for other housing associations.

In recognition of his contributions, Josh was recently named **Rising Star of the Year** at SHARE Annual Conference Awards, in April 2025.

Ore Valley Housing Association's restoration of the former Bowhill Miners Institute building in Cardenden, Fife has secured another national award. The development was a winner at the Scotland Energy Efficiency Awards 2025 in the 'New Build or Renovation Project' category.

Held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Glasgow on the 20th of June, OVHA won top prize alongside the project's architects ECD Architects for its redevelopment of the former Bowhill Miners Institute building in Cardenden, taking the building from a near-ruin to now providing 10 energy efficient homes for social rent.

"Further recognition of this project showcases the tremendous and prolonged effort made by OVHA and our partners including Campion Homes, ECD Architects, Kingdom Housing Association and the Scottish Government to save this historic property and restore it once again to the heart of our community.

They worked together, getting water to villages and building spaghetti bridges by using their inventiveness and creative thinking.
