

Clydesdale's Renewable Heat Project

Clydesdale Housing Association have partnered with Warmworks to deliver a new project that will make homes warmer for tenants in South Lanarkshire. The Renewable Heat Project will see 101 properties fitted with energy efficiency improvements including air source heat pumps, solar PV, battery storage technology, high heat retention heaters, and HeatSage heating controls technology, with the aim of reducing bills and improving home comfort levels for tenants.

This project has been made possible through over 1 million worth of funding from the Scottish Government's Social Housing Net Zero Heat Fund.
