Ore Valley Housing Association's restoration of the former Bowhill Miners Institute building in Cardenden, Fife has secured another national award. The development was a winner at the Scotland Energy Efficiency Awards 2025 in the 'New Build or Renovation Project' category.

Held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Glasgow on the 20<sup>th</sup> of June, OVHA won top prize alongside the project's architects ECD Architects for its redevelopment of the former Bowhill Miners Institute building in Cardenden, taking the building from a near-ruin to now providing 10 energy efficient homes for social rent.

## Civic reception for Elderpark Housing Association to
